STATE OF THE 'COMPETITION'

Last week's round didn't really clarify the position of teams on the points table. This weekend's round could congest the table further. The result of every game this weekend has a major bearing on the top five with only Lakes United reasonably assured of two points with a win over Norths.

Macquarie are at home to Kurri and are in a position where they must win. The side should be more settled this week and have the home ground advantage. But reports from the Coalfields suggest that Kurri are keen to cause another upset and cause heaps of trouble for the Scorpions.

Vale, Eric Gilbert

Eric Gilbert, a former top Newcastle League player of the 1920's, passed away on June 8, at the age of 84 years.

Gilbert, held the distinction of representing his District in three football codes, Soccer, Union and his greatest love Rugby League.

He was once described by the late Jack Mathews in a "Newcastle Herald" article as a "football freak".

Eric was a member of the Norths teams that won the competition in 1925 and 1926, he was also in the 1927 team that lost to South.

In 1927 he played in the Newcastle team that defeated South Sydney.

In 1929, 1930, 1931 he played with Tumut in the Maher Cup and represented Wagga along with the great Eric Weissel.

Eric was nicknamed "Brutus" by his team mates (the Greatest Roman of them all) and "Dirty Gilbert" by his opposition.

He played in most positions in the backline and lock forward, always played the game tough and hard, but fair.

Besides being outstanding in football codes. Eric played tennis and cricket in Newcastle A grade comps.

After his Wagga stint, Eric returned to live at Morisset in 1932 where he resided until his death.

He is survived by his wife Elisa and son Neil, who was a member of the Newcastle Referees' Association in the late 60's early 70's.
