THE MOMENT OF TRUTH FOR SEMI-FINAL CONTENDERS

Four teams put their smei-final chances on the line this weekend in games that could determine their chances of making the final five.

Central Charlestown and Macquarie United clash at Harker Oval on Friday night. Both teams are on eight points from their four wins and although both teams were defeated last weekend this game could be a very close encounter, with so much at stake for them. Central Charlestown held equal second placed team Cessnock to a twelve points to two result while Macquarie United were certainly not disgraced when they went down to Western Suburbs 20 points to eight in the match of the series last weekend.

Waratah-Mayfield on eight points take on competition leaders Lakes United at Waratah Oval on Sunday. The "Cheetahs" were well beaten by South Newcastle in their last game and will certainly have to be at their best to defeat the depending premiers in a game that will determine Waratah's chances of making the semifinals.

Kurri Kurri who are in fifth position on ten points play Western Suburbs at Harker Oval on Sunday. With three teams only two points behind the "Bulldogs" a win for them is important to consolidate their position in the top five.

Western Suburbs played well when they defeated Macquarie United and will not make it easy for Kurri.

The match of the series played between South Newcastle and Cessnock at Cessnock Sports Ground on Saturday could produce some of the best football seen so far this season. South Newcastle have won their last two matches in impressive style with their forwards dominating the games. The Cessnock pack has also played a dominant role in their teams success this season and the clash of these two packs of forwards will be well worth seeing.

South Newcastle are four points away from equal second placed team Cessnock and West and a win for them over the "Goannas" is important in their bid to fill one of the top three positions on the points table.

North Newcastle fresh from their fourteen all draw with Kurri Kurri play Maitland at Passmore Oval on Sunday in the remaining match of the eleventh series. The "Bluebags" must be encouraged by the result of their last game and will be keen to continue the form displayed by them in recent games.

Newcastle has 10 players selected in U16 Northern NSW team. Newcastle again won the Northern NSW section of the CRL Championships, repeating their win in 1985. The 10 Newcastle players are Leigh Ernst, Mark Gayler, Darren Wills, Paul Jones, Stephen McNab and Andrew Tuxford all from Maitland, Dean Walker and Bill Ditton from West, Jason Martin from Mallabula and Kirk Shiels from Lakes who is the son of Tony Shiels the Lakes United hooker from the great Lakes team of 1974/75.

TEN POINTS SEPARATE EIGHT TEAMS IN THIRD GRADE

Only ten points separate the top eight teams in third grade, in fact, four teams Kurri Kurri, Cessnock, Central and Maitland are all sharing fifth position with ten points each.

Waratah retain their first position having ten wins from their eleven games and are two points clear of Lakes United while South Newcastle are in third spot on 16 points.

These teams are in strong positions to fight out the three important first positions. West hold down fourth place on 12 points but are only two clear of the four clubs still in with a chance of making the semi-finals.


