Important Fixture for Kurri and Macquarie

The result of Sunday's match at Knrri Sports Ground between Kurri and Macquarie could very well determine the fifth semi-final position in this years premiership.

Both teams are in equal fifth position on 13 points. However, Macquarie have recorded six wins and a draw to make up their 13 points while Kurri Kurri have won on five occasions but have played three drawn games for their 13 points.

Macquarie have a better attacking record than the "Bulldogs" scoring 314 points compared to their 237, and have also conceded less points than Kurri Kurri.

Both teams have produced their best form of the season in recent games and this match should produce some of the best football of the season and it would not surprise if the final result is very close.

Central Charlestown are three points out of the top five and their clash with Maitland at the Maitland Sports Ground is vital to their chances of taking out a semi-final spot. A loss by the "Bulldogs" would certainly end their chances for the 1086 or th for the 1986 season but a win could still see them force a play off at the end of the competition. In their remaining three games they meet Kurri, South and North. Macquarie United have still to play Cessnock, Waratah and Lakes, while Kurri Kurri play Central, Maitland and South.

Competition leaders Lakes United travel to Cessnock on Sunday to play the "Goannas". Cessnock are four points clear of South in third position and seem certain to finish in the top three, however they will be keen to consolidate their standing on the points table and will not let the "Seagulls" have it all their own way. A close result in this game will also not surprise.
