Semi-final Positions Wide Open

With two series of the 1986 competition remaining recent results have thrown the semi-final positions wide open, in fact no team has yet secured their actual finishing position.

After the 17th series this weekend, the position could be a lot clearer as Lakes United, present competition leaders, play second placed team Western Suburbs who have moved to within one point of Lakes after their win over Maitland and Lakes loss to South Newcastle.

A win in this game by Lakes will give them the Minor title as they would be three points clear of West with only one series remaining, however, if the result is reversed West would move into first position by one point.

Cessnock are two points clear of South Newcastle in the important third position but cannot afford a loss in the last two games if they are to hold that position. The Goannas play North this Sunday at Cessnock Sports Ground and will not be able to take the "Bluebags" lightly after their good win over Waratah last weekend to record their first win of the season. The win was a credit to their coach and the young team who have shown the fighting spirit of the North Club throughout the season. Cessnock play West at Harker Oval in the last match of the competition and therefore must defeat North on Sunday to ensure them of third position.

South Newcastle are assured of finishing no worse than fourth and play Central Charlestown at Townson Oval in a match that the "Butcher Boys" must win. They are now only one point off the top five and a win over South Newcastle would give them a great chance of making the play-offs. They have won their last three games to challenge for a semifinal spot and will be keen to continue their winning form against South Newcastle. Central play North Newcastle in their last game.

Although defeated by Central last weekend Kurri Kurri retain fifth position on the points table by one point but must record a win over Maitland when they meet at the Maittand Sports Ground. These two clubs are traditional rivals and Maitland although their form during this season has been inconsistent they are sure to make Kurri work hard for the two points.

The other team still in a position to claim a semi-final spot is Macquarie United who travel to Waratah on Sunday to play the "Cheetahs". Macquarie are two points away from fifth position after their defeat by Cessnock on Sunday but still hold hopes of making the semi-finals. In their last match of the competition they play competition leaders Lakes United and therefore must win at the weekend to remain in semi-final contention.

The competition as it stands at present is the most open and interesting for many seasons and should ensure some great games of Rugby League in the coming weeks.

The clash of Lakes United and Western Suburbs on Saturday will determine this year's Club champions.


Lakes United lead West at present by 42 points and are certainly favourites to retain the title they won last season. A win for them in any of the three grades against West will give them an unbeatable lead.
