Close Games Predicted in Finals

The 1986 NBN Carlton Breweries premiership has been full of interest throughout the season and the most open in recent years and should ensure that the finals will produce entertaining and close results.

Lakes United clinched the Minor Premiership with a convincing win, 32-6, over rivals Western Suburbs last Saturday. In doing so they scored some great tries in the first half and if they can maintain that form are entitled to favouritism to also take out the major title which they are defending.

WARATAH TAKE OUT MINOR TITLE IN THIRDS

Waratah-Mayfield clinched the third grade minor premiership when they defeated Macquarie United last weekend. With one series remaining Waratah are on 30 points from 15 wins. The teams for and against is the most impressive of the three grades having scored 646 and conceding 112.

South Newcastle and Lakes United are in equal second position on 25 points with Western Suburbs in fourth position on 22.

Maitland's 34-20 win over Kurri Kurri last weekend have put them in fifth position and seem set to take the last semi-linal position. end they turned a half time defeat of 22-6 into a 28-24 win to score their fourth win in as many games to challenge for the fifth position in the semi-linals.

The "Butcher Boys" are now in a great position to make the linals, but their moment of truth will be when South Newcastle play Kurri Kurri at Kurri on Saturday. A win for Kurri will ensure them of the fifth position however, if this result is reversed Central who play North on Sunday would take out the semi-final place with a win over the "Bluebags".

Macquarie United who have enjoyed one of their most successful seasons in recent years still hold faint hopes of forcing a play off to gain a semi-final position. To achieve this Macquarie would have to defeat Lakes in their last game and Kurri would have to be defeated by South and Central go down to North Newcastle.

The odds are certainly against Macquarie, however, results this season have at times been unpredictable and Macquarie will be hoping this continues.

Western Suburbs and Cessnock have clinched second and third place respectively and will play in the preliminary semi-final for the right to play Lakes United in the Major semi-final.
