IT COULDN'T BE CREAMIER

SEMI-FINALISTS DETERMINED

With 16 series of competition matches played the four semi-finalists in first grade have been determined. They are Western Suburbs, South Newcastle, Central Newcastle and Maitland. West, South and Central are together on the points table with 24 points, while Maitland is only 2 behind on 22 points.

There are another two competition series to be played before the semi-finals however and the minor premiership winner will probably not be known until these games are dispensed with.

This weekend Maitland and West oppose each other and the following week Central goes in against West and Maitland and South oppose each other.

In reserve grade South Newcastle is already minor premier but Central, Lakes, West, Cessnock, Maitland and Kurri are so close together on points that any three of the six teams can join South for the semi-final berths.

The Third Grade competition is also being keenly contested. West (26) has a precarious lead of only one point ahead of Maitland and when they meet this weekend either team could be the leader, although a drawn match could still allow West to remain at the top.

Kurri follows with 24 points, then comes Cessnock (22), Central (21), and South, with an outsider's chance, on 18 points.

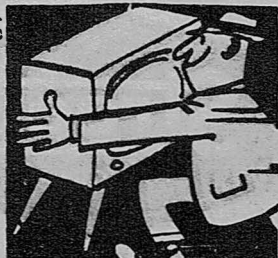
