KEITH MADDISON Central's coach, had a very good game last weekend. His 3 pointer late in the second stanza was a just reward for consistent play.


MACQUARIE UNITED raffle conducted at No. 1 Sports Ground last Saturday, "Vulcan Heater" was won by ticket number 22533.
