North Ladies' Committee are busy making arrangements for the big cabaret to be held on May 30th in Transport Hall, Hamilton.

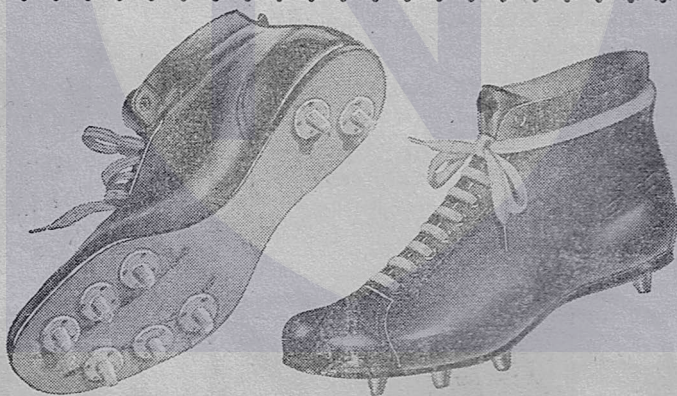
