MACQUARIE BREAK THROUGH FOR FIRST WIN

Macquarie United registered their first points of the 1986 premiership with a 56 points to 14 win over Maitland last weekend. The win comes as no great surprise as Macquarie even though defeated in their first three games have shown the form that indicated they could still play a big part in this year's premiership.

In their first series game they held the powerful West team to a ten point margin when they went down twelve points to two and in their second match went down to Central eighteen points to twelve and then held South Newcastle to live points in a match that could have gone either way before their win over Maitland.

The points for and against tell the story for the improving "Scorpions" notching up 94 points for and conceding 83. This would be the most encouraging start Macquarie have had in first grade for many seasons.

Macquarie captain, Peter Alexander has lost none of his ability as a Rugby League player and is being well supported by his front rowers Peter Lockwood and Terry Stevenson.

Olaf Prattl in his second year as coach of the "Scorpions" is sure to keep the pressure on his players to continue the form they are currently displaying and by doing this they will become semi-final contenders as the season progresses.

The three undefeated teams, Cessnock, West and Lakes again served notice that they will be the teams to beat, however, Waratah's win over Central has moved them up to four points with Kurri Kurri and both

these teams are well within striking distance of the leaders.

Although defeated by West in their last game. South Newcastle served notice that they are capable of causing upsets to the leading teams and with their reserve grade and third grade teams undefeated after four games the club has an abundance of talent that is required to ensure the club of a successful season.

While the results in some of the games have been "one sided" the competition still holds a great deal of interest and no teams should be "written off" at this stage.
