#### EDDIE LUMSDEN

#### Fifteen Test appearances for Australia

Eddie Lumsden was the best of a fine footballing family — so good that he held a virtual mortgage on a Test wing spot for years in the early 1960s.

Lumsden had joined St. George in 1957, from the NSW coalfields town of Kurri Kurri. He represented both Sydney and NSW in that first season.

Lumsden played his first Test in 1959 and when he bowed out of the representative arena four years later had appeared in 15 Tests and made two overseas tours (to England and France with the 1959-60 Kangaroos and to New Zealand in 1961).

He was no less brilliant for St. George, staying with them 10 years and scoring a club record 164 tries. Only once during his stay with the Dragons did he miss out on a grand final win. That was in 1960, when an injury forced him out of the line-up.
