TED BURGESS is Macquaric's ground steward again this season. It is a big job looking after all the gear and the goal posts, especially when the ground is shared with another code.



WHAT a display of brilliant football young Glen Golden is showing at the moment. One of Lakes United Juniors, really giving everything for his team.


HITTING the high spots for the "Goannas" in lower grades is Gary Sampson, who won the best player award last week. He and Owen Taylor are working up a fine combination.

PLAYING good football with Kurri reserve grade is Peter Rouse, keep scoring those tries Pete. Congratulations also on your recent engagement.


