A feature of North's win last week was the grand display given by Cecil Bull. This player has played well in every game so far, but last week was his best.

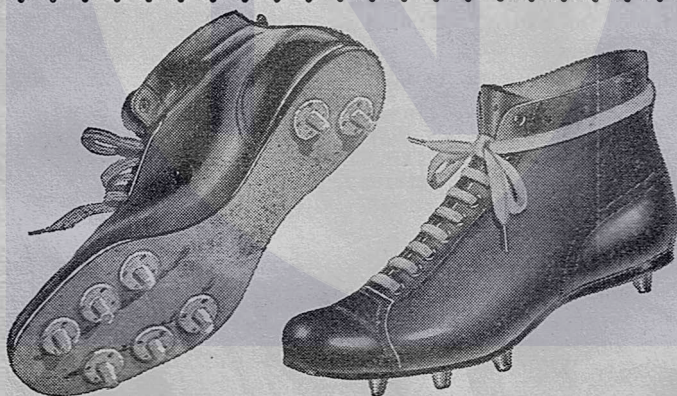
North's young centre Les Bowditch made a very successful debut in senior grade last week. This lad fitted into the team combination extra well and climaxed his day with a good try.
