Don (Doc) Bland, has been showing good form with South thirds, as skipper Doc is proving a great help to some of the younger players.

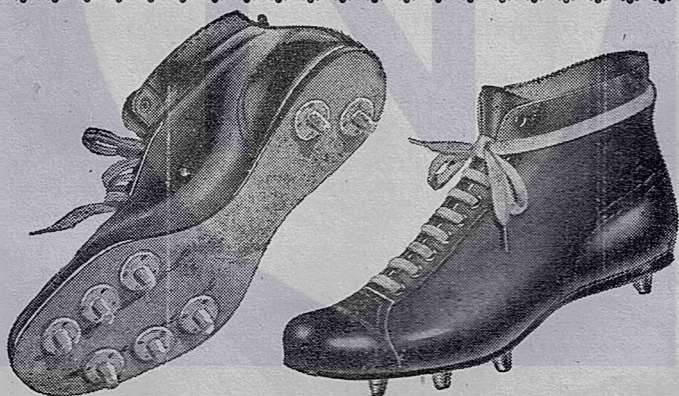
Cessnock treasurer Colin Springbett is taking over a new job within the next couple of weeks and all wish him every success in his new employment.
