# Interesting Fixtures this Weekend

With the 1986 premiership nearing the half way mark every game is important and this weekend's games should produce some very close results,

Maitland are at home to competition leaders Western Suburbs and they will be keen to continue their improved form which they displayed against Central last weekend when they went down twelve points to seven with their team now starting to settle down under their new coach Peter Sharp. Maitland is capable and should cause some upsets as the season progresses.

Kurri Kurri and Central Charlestown both winners from last weekend meet at the Kurri Sports Ground in what should be a close game.

Against Macquarie last week Kurri turned a twenty points to eight deficit into a twenty-four points to twenty win to show the fighting spirit of the "Bulldogs", while Central accounted for Maitland at St. John Oval in what was an entertaining game of Rugby League.

Cessnock will be keen to get back on the winners list when they play Macquarie United at home. After putting together four wins in a row the "Goannas" have been defeated in their last two games by Waratah and Lakes to be in third position on the points table. Cessnock this season have produced some outstanding form and will certainly make the "Scorpions" earn every point in this game.

Although defeated last week by Kurri Kurri, Macquarie have displayed some of their best form in recent years and are sure to test the talented Cessnock team in their game.

In what should be another great game Lakes United play South New-

castle at Cahill Oval. Lakes are only one point away from leaders Western Suburbs and the defending premiers have displayed the form that makes them the team to beat again this year.
