Well, boys, to-day is your last chance to impress the selectors before the Newcastle Team to play France is chosen, so go to it and let us see some really worth-while football.

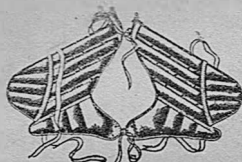
