

DECIDER TO 'NOCKS AT MAITLAND

More than 700 people went by special train from Newcastle to Maitland for the Cessnock v. Central grand final on October 7, 1950. Before a crowd of more than 5000 at Maitland Showground, Cessnock won its first premiership since 1941 when it defeated Central 19-12. Bill Sneddon was Cessnock's captain.

When former Kangaroo winger Eddie Lumsden was appointed to the CRL selection panel in 1977 it ended a period of two years that the Newcastle district had been without a selector on the country panel. In gaining the appointment he completed the unusual first-year double of becoming a representative from that body on the State selection panel.

Maitland club imposed a transfer fee of \$8000 on representative fiveeighth Alan Powell before the start of the 1969 season. This followed

month's of wrangling on Powell's bid to transfer to Penrith and threats of 'legal action by him to gain his release. Powell's fee was reduced on appeal to \$5500 after which further negotiation took place before he joined Penrith.

Northern Suburbs was Newcastle's nomination for the Clayton Cup in 1959 after winning the first-grade minor premiership and being defeated only once in the season. The Clayton Cup is a trophy awarded by the Country Rugby League for the most successful team in the country, irrespective of the standard of the competition played. Dubbo Macquarie was awarded the trophy in 1959.

Two former Newcastle players lined up as members of the NSW Country team in a match against New Zealand at No. 1 Sports Ground in May, 1975. The players were prop and captain Jim Morgan, a Maitland product, and winger Eric White, formerly of Lakes. Morgan then was playing at Queanbeyan and White at Dapto.

Waratah-Mayfield tried five hookers in nine weeks early in 1964 in a bid to gain more possession from set scrums. The club tried Tommy Mullins, Ron Stanton, Ross Williams and Peter Murphy before giving the job to Fred Ford, who had had first-grade experience with both Waratah and Western Suburbs.
