At the conclusion of the season, successful functions were held in the form of a Smoke Concert and picnic to Lake Macquarie, the former being possibly the best ever held. At the latter the bonus to players from the League, amounting to £157/10/00 was distributed on the per. capita rate eight shillings and tuppence per match.

The attached balance sheet from your Honorary Treasurer should afford you satisfaction as it shows the working of your Club has been conducted with strict economy, and you have in hand to commence the 1922 season, the very satisfactory balance of £12/00/06.

In submitting this report for your approval, we trust that an even greater share of success will be yours during the coming season. We are confident we have the material in all Grades, and sincerely hope that with the new ground available for training purpose, and our players giving strict attention to keeping throughly fit, we will conclude the seaon of 1922 Premiers in all Grades.
