#### 1967 — BLUES WIN GRAND FINAL THRILLER

Twenty years since the game, and even today Newcastle League fans talk of Norths magnificent 1967 Grand Final win over Minor Premiers Western Suburbs.

A capacity crowd at No. 1 Sportsground was thrilled from start to finish with sharp attack and tremendous defence from both sides, before the outstanding leadership and tactical play of Norths captain-coach Jack "Croaker" Gill eventually prevailed to spearhead the underdogs to a memorable 13-11 triumph over the defending premiers.

Norths led 2-0 after 14 mins, when Gill landed a 35 metre penalty goal, 4 minutes later Wests captain/coach John Hobby equalised with a neat field goal.

Norths regained the lead in the 21st minute when ½ back Brian Askie scored afterforwards Dennis Nichols and Bill Mattingly had combined to carry play from inside their half to within two metres of Wests line. From the ensuing play-the-ball Norths swung play across field and Askie crossed wide out. Gill's conversion attempt was astray.

Norths led 5-2 but Wests came back strongly when their champion centre, the footballing priest Father John Cootes, with a brilliant individual effort, eluded three tackles in a sensational 40 metre run to score. He converted his try from wide out and Wests led 7-5.

A jurther long range penalty goal by Cootes before 1/2 time saw Wests leading 9-5 at the break with the 2nd half wind advantage.

Gill narrowed the gap with a great penalty goal from near half-way and into the wind immediately after the resumption, but Cootes replied with his third goal and Wests stayed ahead 11-7.

The sustained defensive effort from both sides continued, but North drew level with further Gill penalty goals in the 14th and 25th minutes of the second half.

8 minutes from the finish Wests were caught offside in front of their posts. Gill again raised the flags and the Blues hit the lead 13-11.

"Croaker" Gill capped his fine display of kicking and general leadership with a superb tactical strategy over the dying stages.

Under the existing rules, and much to their frustration, Wests were forced to restart play with a drop kick, thus surrendering possession. Norths controlled the ball for 6½ of the final 8 minutes.

Full-time was greeted with a tumultuous roar from the hordes of Norths fans.

#### The 'Newcastle Sun' reported:

They sat bare-chested — tired but triumphant — drinking champagne from paper cubs. Around them the dressing room erupted with noise, laughter and beer. They were North — the mighty North — and once again they were champions of Newcastle Rugby League. They had won it the North way, the only way they knew how.
